MORNING SUPERVISION / DROP-OFF SYSTEM

GARDEN COMMITTEE

Our Garden Committee have been a busy bunch since returning to school. We are thrilled to tell you we won the "Best School Overall" in the Tidy Towns awards 2017. We harvested our vegetables and sold our produce and in doing so we raised €100 which will go towards future garden projects. Thank you so much for all your support. Our winter projects are in full swing and we are creating a bug hotel and bird feeders to ensure our local wildlife are safe, warm and well fed for the winter. Many thanks to the CE Scheme and the Tidy Towns Committee for your continued support in helping create our garden.

RESULTS OF PARENTAL QUESTIONNAIRE

Last term the Board distributed a questionnaire to all parents of children attending the school to ascertain their views on a number of issues. 263 questionnaires were returned representing 112 families with children in the junior end of the school (JI -2^{nd} Class), 127 families with children in the senior end $(3^{rd} - 6^{th} \text{ class})$ and 19 families with children both in the junior and senior classes. 96% of respondents said their child/children were happy in school and that they were happy with the standard of education they were receiving. 94% of parents said they wanted the practice of taking the children to the Christmas Panto in the Helix to continue and 85% who wanted it continued wanted the children brought every year. Two thirds of parents said they wanted their children to continue to be involved with the production of Christmas Cards. The initiative will continue but no parent should feel under pressure to buy cards if they do not want them. 93% of parents said they wanted us to continue the tradition of singing carols at Dunnes Stores and 96% were in favour of educational trips throughout the year. 84% of parents asked that the cost of trips be kept below €25. The Panto and the 1st Class Witches and Wizards Wood Walk were the two most popular trips listed. A number of parents made some further suggestions across a range of activities/topics and these are being looked at to further improve our school for our pupils. A big Thank You to all who took the time to complete and return the survey.

GREEN SCHOOLS

The Green-Schools are working hard to achieve our 3rd green flag. This year's theme is water. Well done to Ms. Carroll's 3rd class who came up with our new catchy water code for the school:

Come on Scoil Bhríde let's go! We need to get saving our water flow.

The green committee is asking all the children in the school to learn the code off by heart. They have also started a campaign called 'Water Wednesday' where everyone is encouraged to bring water in their lunch-boxes.

The green committee hasn't forgotten about our recycling commitments and recently came first place in Offaly for collecting the most recyclable batteries for WEEE Ireland. An impressive 125kg of batteries were collected and recycled! Well done to all involved.
