GREEN SCHOOLS

Scoil Bhríde's Green Schools Committee have been working hard to identify ways to help save energy. Here are three top energy saving tips you can try at home:

1. Buy energy efficient light bulbs (CFLs) instead of traditional bulbs – they use 1/5th energy and last up to 10 times as long. They will pay for themselves in under a year and from then on they are saving you on your electricity bill
2. Attic Insulate – insulating your attic will keep the heat in your home for longer and pay for itself in 2-3 years.
3. Fit a lagging jacket – lagging your hot water tank will keep the water hotter for longer and will have paid for itself in a few months.
