RAINBOWS PROGRAMME

As part of our School Care Programme, We are delighted to be in a position to offer children from first class to sixth class who have experienced loss through bereavement, separation or divorce in their family the opportunity, to participate in the Rainbows 12 week programme beginning after the Halloween break.

When something significant happens in a family, the entire family is affected. If a parent dies or parents separate, not only do the parents grieve, the children do also. Grief is an expression of love and a normal human reaction to a significant loss

Children find it difficult to verbalise their feelings of grief because of their age and inexperience. It may surface in their behaviour, schoolwork and emotional well-being.

Rainbows is a support group that helps children put their feelings into words, work through their grief, build a stronger sense of self-esteem, and begin to adapt to what has taken place in the family. Rainbows is not a counselling group. It is a safe, confidential setting where children will share their feelings with each other and with trained facilitators. Children are grouped with others of a similar age experiencing a similar loss. There are usually 3-5 in a group. If only one participant is present at any session, the session maybe cancelled for that week.

A letter will go home to each child on the 17th of October and we would invite you to discuss the contents of the letter with your child in advance of application to attend Rainbows so that they understand what Rainbows is about.

If you have any queries about the Rainbow Programme, please contact Mr. Carney (Rainbows Co-ordinator), your child's class teacher or ask at reception.

PEDESTRAIN ACCESS

NOTES FOR PARENTS

COMMUNICATION

Communication between home and school is very important. Parents should feel free to talk to their child's teacher at any time during the school year. However, in the interest of ensuring the safety of all pupils, teachers cannot meet parents at classroom doors. If you would like to meet your child's teacher, an appointment should be arranged at a mutually agreeable time. In the event that a resolution is not reached, meetings can then be arranged with the school principal, again, by appointment only (Parents are advised to contact the school at the phone number overleaf to arrange an appointment with the teacher).

We would ask that parents do not contact the Principal and/or staff to seek information or arrange meetings outside of school hours, including weekends, public holidays and/or during school holiday periods. The Principal and staff do not have access to pupils' records during these times. Should parents require documents to be completed or signed this can only be facilitated during school hours.

DROP OFF AND SUPERVISION

The Board of Management of Scoil Bhríde would like to take this opportunity to thank parents for their cooperation with the schools drop off system. We would like to remind parents that supervision at Scoil Bhríde Primary School is from 8:35 am to 1:30 pm (Junior & Senior Infants) and from 8:35 am to 2:30 pm for all other classes. We ask parents to promptly collect their child at 1:30 pm and 2:30 pm respectively. The school cannot be responsible for children outside of these hours. Therefore we remind parents that children should not be brought to school prior to 8.35am in the morning as there is no supervision in place and children are not covered by insurance.

HOMEWORK CLUB
