SURVEY ON SCHOOL UNIFORMS

The Minister for Education and Skills, Ruairí Quinn, requested a survey be undertaken with all parents/guardians regarding school uniforms. We conducted our survey in mid-March. In, summary, the results of our school uniform survey indicate the majority of parents (98%) want the school to have a school uniform. Parents want a mix of clothing that allows them to purchase some items in Department Stores but they also want to keep the bespoke pre-crested items to retain the quality and the unique identity of the school. The majority of parents feel the school jacket should be compulsory but some parents suggest an improvement in its quality is needed. The Board is currently investigating jacket suppliers with a view to ensuring the best quality and price is sourced for our jacket going forward. Parents will be informed of the outcome as soon as the information becomes available.
