

## French Classes

## attendance

All absences from school should be explained to the class teacher in writing by a parent/guardian. A record of all absences is maintained by the school. The effect of absences on a child's progress and behaviour will be documented. Under the Education Welfare Act (2000), the school is legally bound to report to the Welfare Board any child who is absent from school for 20 days or more. Where there is no justifiable reason parents are liable to prosecution by the Welfare Board.

## NOTES FOR PARENTS

### communication

Communication between home and school is very important. Parents should feel free to talk to their child's teacher at any time during the school year. However, in the interest of ensuring the safety of all pupils, teachers cannot meet parents at classroom doors. If you would like to meet your child's teacher an appointment should be arranged at a mutually agreeable time. In the event that a resolution is not reached, meetings can then be arranged with the school principal, again, **by appointment only** (Parents are advised to contact the school at the phone number overleaf to arrange an appointment with the teacher/principal).

We would ask that parents do not contact the Principal and/or staff to seek information or arrange meetings outside of school hours, including weekends, public holidays and/or during school holiday periods. The Principal and staff do not have access to pupils' records during these times. Should parents require documents to be completed or signed this can only be facilitated during school hours.

### Morning lines

We would like to remind parents to move to the side near the exit when the first bell rings at 8:50 am. Teachers walk with their pupils in an orderly line into the appropriate building following the second bell.

### Health and safety

In the interests of '*health and safety*' we ask that:

- parents do **not** smoke on school grounds.
- pets are **not** to be brought onto school grounds.

### Homework club

Mr. McDonnell, Mr. Spain, Mr. Carney and Mr. O'Regan are delighted to inform you that an after school Homework Club will be commencing on Monday the 24<sup>th</sup> of September. The Homework Club will be made available for children from First to Fourth Class. Study will commence at 2:30 pm each day and conclude at 3:30 pm. The Homework Club will take place each week up until the Christmas holidays. It will be supervised by teachers at all times in a quiet atmosphere conducive to study. Those students who finish their work early will be further challenged by teachers with literacy and numeracy activities.

Payment for the club can be made to your class teacher in a sealed envelope labelled '*Homework Club*'. Payment options for your child/children include the following;

- ♦ An upfront payment of €150 can be made to cover 12 weeks of Homework Club up until Christmas.
- ♦ Alternatively a payment of €75 may be made upfront and the remaining amount can be paid on the first week of school after the midterm.

We would like to remind parents that places in the Homework Club are limited, and will be provided on a first come first serve basis.

### supervision

The hours of supervision at Scoil Bhríde Primary School are from 8:50 am to 1:30 pm (Junior & Senior Infants) and from 8:50 am to 2:30 pm for all other classes. We ask parents to promptly collect their child at 1:30 pm and 2:30 pm respectively. The school cannot be responsible for children outside of these hours. Therefore we remind parents that children should not be brought to school prior to 8.50 am on wet mornings.

### Outstanding fees

Parents are reminded to send in all outstanding fees for their child's *Book Rental/Art and Photocopying/Testing* on or before Friday 28<sup>th</sup> of September.

### School choir
