As you will be aware from recent media coverage, the Minister for Education & Skills, Mr. Ruairí Quinn, has started a new process to look at the possible transfer of some schools run by the Catholic Church to other patron bodies in 44 areas around the country. Edenderry has been selected as one of those 44 areas.

Parents of primary and pre-school children in Edenderry will soon be asked to complete an on-line survey indicating their preference as to what type of primary school that they would like their children to attend.

In September 2007, Scoil Bhríde Primary School was established as a Catholic School by the Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Kildare & Leighlin. The responses of parents to the on-line survey will be used to consider what changes, if any, could be made to widen the choice of primary schools in Edenderry.

The Board of Management of Scoil Bhríde Primary School will keep parents informed of this process according as information is made available to them from the Dept. of Education & Skills.

In the meantime, I wish everybody an enjoyable Midterm break and we look forward to welcoming all our pupils back on Monday the 5^{th} of November.
