In the context of the risk assessment that must be undertaken by schools, the Children First Act, 2015 refers to risk as "any potential for harm" they are participating in the activities of the school and that some school activities will carry low or minimal risks of harm compared to others It is acknowledged that schools already have in place a range of policies, practices and procedures to mitigate the risk of harm to children while
